3.0 PUBLIC COMMENTS

George Miller-<u>(THS Teacher)</u> – George was given the task of writing THS/ CTE Pathway, and worked on it during winter break. There was an agreement with him and the principal. In favor of Mr. Sandoval staying at the high school.

Ro González (Parent)-Is concerned that Dual enrollment Enrollment (DE) will end and not have the opportunity himself. Stated that Mr. Sandoval started the CDE program and would like Mr. Sandoval to stay at THS. Another concern was how many students fit on a bus? Has seen students sitting in the aisle. Henry Ortiz-SJES Teacher -ELA Books 7-12 training an also with the Science/History books there is a concern with the timeline. They are willing to meet over the summer. The teachers are upset with the seven teachers being moved. In the past it has been because of losing teachers, and would like an explanation.

Espie Sandoval-THS Teacher-Referring to the move from THS to RDR, said the CTE classes would be great for the continuation students. DE classes for Parents/students to decide on 11units if able too. A question asked regarding the RDR graduating rate over the last five years.

E. Avalos (THS Student)-shared 192 signatures (petition) not to move Mr. Sandoval. Questioning who is calling the fraud (Sandoval & DE) WHC had a presentation on DE.

J. Martinez (THS Teacher)-would be speaking on behalf of our teachers at THS, Shores and Sandoval. In favor of Sandoval staying at THS. Was there a debt saving from offering DE classes? Questioned why we didn't resend the lay off for Shores and give her another chance.

Citly Gonzalez (THS Teacher)-wanted to advocate for Mr. Sandoval and DE classes. Questioning the course scope and sequence. Also feels there is over crowding on the buses.

Ceballos-Wanted to give support for Mr. Sandoval staying at the high school.

Cielo, Márquez (THS Teacher)- in support of Mr. Sandoval and his work with WHC because THS doesn't offer AP courses. Mr. Sandoval helps the students to believe in themselves.

Rocio Avalos-Thanked the teachers, parents and students for being present for Mr. Sandoval. Was wondering and concerned with the amountnumber of classes students can take from WHC.

Marfana-Mariana Acosta-spoke in favor of both Mr. Sandoval and Ms. Shores. Both great teachers and

motivates the students with high expectations. **Kimberly Valadez** (THS Teacher)-Gave a testimonial referring to Mr. Sandoval and WHC. Ms. Shores as a great English Teacher.

Ms. Shores-She enjoyed getting students to read books and always enjoyed the classroom.
